This booklet is special made for you that want to learn the secrets on how to groom your member or like some call it; intimate hair removal.

If you follow our guidelines, you will get a good result that gives you more confidence and a larger member.



“The three will look taller, if you trim the bush.”

Step 1

The first step is to buy a beard or hair trimmer and trim the pubic area to less than 1/4". This will make the hair easier to shave later, because longer hair is more likely to clog a razor. Using a beard trimmer will work better than scissors and it will cut the hair shorter.

Please avoid using an electric razor on the scrotum. The skin of the scrotum is so thin and loose that the shaver can catch it and this is extremely painful. If for some reason you still feel you should use a men's electric razor, avoid shaving down the center of the underside of the member and on the center of the scrotum, as a cut there is also extremely painful.

Step 2

The second step is to take a hot shower, because this will soften the hair.



Step 3

The third step is to get in position. Ensure the room you are using for shaving will be private for at least an hour or however long you think the process will take. This is not something you want to rush through!

Consider shaving sitting in a very shallow hot bath. The hot water in the bath will prepare the area for shaving better than showering. Your body will be very stable (you are sitting down) and your genitals are very accessible. You also have a handy source of water in which to rinse the razor. If this is not possible consider shaving sitting down, ideally on the floor for ease of access and stability.

If you use the edge of a toilet seat to sit on, letting your pubic area sit over a garbage can while shaving, the mess will be next to nothing to clean up.

If you prefer standing, try shaving in your shower. Just make sure to stand out of the water to avoid watering down your shave lather, and constantly rinse your blade. By shaving at the start of the shower, you will let any cuts close themselves and thus avoid any stains in your clothes.

Step 4

In step four you should lather the area with BYB Intimate Shaving Cream intended for sensitive skin.

Step 5

In step five you should use a new 3, 4 or 5 bladed razor, shave each area-using short, very light strokes. The key in shaving the genital area is to always make sure the section of skin you're shaving is taut; shaving loose skin can lead to cuts, because the skin will move with the razor and create an uneven surface. The following tips are for shaving against the direction of growth ("against the grain" - which produces the smoothest shave) but note that if you first shave in the direction the hair is growing, you will shorten most of it. Then shaving in the opposite direction will be easier, but some people find it sufficient to just shave in the direction of growth and stop there, especially since shaving against the grain is more likely to result in ingrown hairs and razor bumps.

Step 6

Step six you pull the member downward and shave from the top of the member upward to the navel.

Step 7

Step seven hold the member to the side and shave inwards in the sides of it and in the sides of the scrotum.

Step 8

Step eight hold the member upward and shave downwards carefully from the member to the lower part of the scrotum.

Step 9

Step nine you will see that the scrotum is much easier to shave if the skin is extended. The scrotum should be shaved from the middle front part of it, to the sides, with extreme care.

Step 10

In step ten you rinse off and wash the area using mild soap.

Step 11

In step eleven you should pat dry and remember to be gentle, because rubbing with the towel will increase irritation.

Step 12

In step twelve when you are done with shaving then you put BYB Unisex Aftershave Lotion on, because it will minimize skin irritation. If you are shaving the first or second time it will most likely irritate the skin, once the hair starts growing back. This can lead to itching and redness. This will be gone within a week roughly and once you start shaving more often it will stop.

Some extra tips for you

Rinse the razor between every stroke, and pull any of the long hairs out of it before continuing.

If you just glide over the skin without applying pressure you won't cut yourself.

It is best to shave when the scrotum is ascended - meaning tight against the body. The piece of skin that goes between the shaft and the sack may be especially problematic. One thing you can do is take an ice cubes into the shower and rub it on the scrotum to tighten things up. It can help get rid of that flap of skin between the shaft and the scrotum.

Some men do not shave all the hair off. Shave the member and scrotum; trim the hair surrounding them up to the navel and on your behind, maybe also on the inner upper side of your legs. Then go ahead and trim the pubic hair up to the naval on the sides. One option is to leave a patch of hair just above your member similar to a "landing strip" on women.

The first times it should be somewhat difficult and even you could produce some cuts. Don't be alarmed, just clean well and eventually the skin will become accustomed and more resistant (and yourself, or the shaver, more experienced to avoid such situations).



Be careful tips

Never shave while inebriated, as you will end up regretting all the cuts in the morning more than the hangover.

The itching, oh the itching! Once the hair starts to grow back it can be itchy. You either have to shave again or put up with the itching. Once you have shaved a few times the skin becomes used to the treatment and usually the itching subsides.

Don't shave before exercising. Not only will the sweat irritate the area, but the friction from running or other movement will irritate the area as well.

Salt on an open wound hurts, so too does sweat on a recently shaved scrotum. It's a mild sting but be ready for it.

If you get any cuts, avoid any sexual activity involving your genitals until the cuts are completely healed. If you or your partner has any sexually transmitted diseases or infections, it will likely get transmitted.
